QUICK STATS

- 2 million incarcerated per year, at a total cost of \$62 billion/year.
- That's 1 in every 160 U.S. citizens. At a cost \$31,000/year/inmate.
- 1 million are released from **prison** a year. That's 50% of the yearly incarcerated.
- 9 million released yearly from jail.
- 40% will go back to prison within 3 years of release.
- The rate of released prisoners expected to increase considerably for the foreseeable future.
- And with it, the rate of recidivism.

Most online open data about resources, programs, products and services are practically useless because they are:

- Outdated
- Incomplete
- Irrelevant
- Inaccurate
- Not user-friendly

- Curated list w/OpenReferral.org standard.
- Information exchange via API

- Built-in background verification.
